I created the piece 'Reincarnated' when my country Nigeria was in chaos in 2020 as the youths stood up and decided to protest for their rights. That was boldness like no one had seen in the eyes of the youth since the end of the civil war that my father told me of. The unity was such beauty as I had never imagined in my entire life. To be honest, I was proud of my generation.



They might have killed our past heroes who fought for freedom and equality around the world, heroes like Ken Sarowiwa, Fela, Malcom X, Martin Luther, 2pac and others but when this protest started in my country against SARS (Special Anti Robbery Squad) I saw one thing: I saw the vision that these dead heroes had in them. The dream for equality and love. This piece 'Reincarnated' to me means that they can kill the body but they cannot kill the visions and dreams that live inside us.

During the protest, our government began to get frustrated, because we had locked down the toll gate and restricted movement for normal businesses.
